Types of dog grooming scissors

Straight scissors

The straight dog grooming scissors are the most used by professional groomers as they are the most multi-purpose scissor of them all. They can be used to groom all areas of your dog regardless of his breed or coat type.

Curved scissors

The curve of the scissors varies depending on the desired finish and coat of the dog, as you may encounter curved scissors with longer and a more gradual curve than others that are better suited for larger dog breeds.

Shears

Dog grooming shears are not very different from the ones used by a barber or a hairdresser. They are basically the same hand-operated shearing tool with sharpened blades that cut through hair or any other thin material, but because of the significant differences between human hair and a dog's coat, they vary in certain aspects.

Thinning Scissors

This odd-looking grooming tool with teeth is intended for removing bulk and helping groomers get a more blended and smooth finish. Thinning dog grooming scissors with more prominent teeth remove a more significant amount of hair, while the ones with smaller teeth are less aggressive. This type of shears will be of great help when blending the lower and upper trim of dogs with a coat such as a Schnauzer or a Cocker Spaniel.

Scissor sets

A scissors set is basically a cluster of all the previous dog grooming scissors mentioned above, varying in size or weight depending on the desired finish. Take into consideration the size of your dog and the thickness of his coat before acquiring a shear set, as not all of them might suit you and your pooch.

- Small dog breeds can require a lot of time at the groomers, which adds to their upkeep expense
