





Campus Movie Fest Launches Second-Leg of 19th Annual Tour

ATLANTA (Jan. 13, 2020) - <u>Campus Movie Fest</u> (CMF), the world's largest student film festival, is continuing its 19th annual tour to 50 universities across the U.S. CMF provides professional video equipment and training to students to make five-minute films in one week, at no cost to them. At the end of the week, judges rate the submissions, and the top 16 movies are screened at a red carpet premiere on campus.

The 2019 - 2020 CMF Spring Tour launches with East Carolina University and University of Central Florida on Jan. 22. The Spring Tour will visit more than 25 universities and colleges, including Georgia State University, University of South Carolina, Northeastern University, Rutgers University, Fordham University and University of California, Los Angeles.

"Campus Movie Fest is an opportunity to give students the technology and training to tell their stories," said David Roemer, CEO, Ideas United and co-founder, Campus Movie Fest and Ideas United. "In addition to working with first-time filmmakers, CMF has been at the forefront of discovering the next generation of creators and providing them with the platform to share their voices."

Once submitted, students' films are judged in several categories, including best picture, actor, actress, comedy, drama, and more. Special partner categories include <u>The Walt Disney Company's Women in Film</u>, <u>Elfenworks Foundation's Hope in Social Justice</u> and <u>Ideas United's Pitch This</u>. On each campus, four films will be selected as Jury Award winners and will screen during the <u>CMF Terminus Conference + Film Festival</u>, <u>June 25-27, 2020</u>. All Spring semester Jury Award Winners are eligible to receive an invitation to screen and attend the <u>2021 Cannes Film Festival</u>.
