As a foster child with a terminal illness, two-year-old Carter needed to be adopted soon. Without parents to make decisions about his healthcare, his young life would be in the hands of the state of Missouri.

He was on a waitlist for Extreme Family Finding, our program responsible for identifying extended family members of children in foster care. Carter's foster family could not continue to care for him, and we worried that he would have to be moved to another foster home, further delaying the possibility of adoption.

Through Extreme Family Finding, our program responsible for identifying extended family members of children in foster care, we worked tirelessly to expedite the process of finding Carter a forever home. He needed a family that would offer him unconditional security and love, no matter how long he had to enjoy it.

Kids with serious illnesses often bounce around within the foster care system without getting adopted, but this would not be Carter's fate. By the end of that same weekend, our Extreme Family Finders had found Carter a perfect fit.

To this couple, Carter was worth more than his diagnosis. He was a curious, spirited toddler, full of joy and affection. They fell in love with him immediately, and adopted him six months later.



EXTREME FAMILY FINDING™

Too often, children linger in care because there are not enough families willing to adopt. Extreme Family Finding™ puts a team of recruiters and private investigators to work finding multiple extended family members, kin relationships, and other sources of relational permanency for children and youth. As a result, 80% of the children served are matched with permanency resources and 90% are reconnected with safe and appropriate lifelong support.



Transitioning into adulthood is already fraught with hurdles, but especially so for youth who age out of foster care without being reunified or adopted. Community Youth Connections Project® (CCYP) helps older foster youth navigate the struggles of being thrust into adulthood with no resources or support system.

ANYTHING BUT EASY

Blair's life had been anything but easy. A former foster child, she was now homeless and had been fired from her job after filing a sexual harassment complaint. At 20 years old, Blair was finding it difficult to remain optimistic about her future.

Blair also had two young daughters who had been removed from her home after their paternal grandmother, Lou, reported Blair to the Children's Division for neglect. Lou had been the girls' caretaker ever since.

Through our Community Connections Youth Project® (CCYP), Blair found a new job at a nursing home. Next, we helped her get an apartment, as well as pay off her past eviction. Blair was a strong, driven young woman, but she was entering adulthood without the guidance and love of a family and struggling to do it on her own. From gifting her a used car to helping her with legal counsel, we did everything we could to give Blair extra resources and assistance. Once she had a place to live and a steady job, she could begin working toward her ultimate goal: getting her kids back.

Due to the trauma she had experienced in foster care, Blair struggled with her mental health. The last important step toward getting her kids back was to demonstrate that she was stable and taking her medication. Now that she was healthy, employed, and had a place to live, Blair could rebuild the relationship with her daughters, starting with regular visitations. Lou delayed the reunification process at every chance she had, accusing Blair of being back on drugs.

In the end, Blair received custody of her daughters so long as they could continue to have regular visits with their grandma. She felt an overwhelming sense of relief and joy as she showed her girls their new bedroom in her apartment. She now felt prepared to move forward and begin creating a new life for herself and her girls.
