Did You Know?

District residents who are 16+ years old can get their own Warren-Newport Public Library card, without needing a signature from a parent or guardian at time of registration. With a WNPL card, teens can checkout items from library collections, as well as digital downloads and streaming of ebooks, audiobooks, movies and music!



- Bring a school ID and a piece of mail with their name and address from the last 90 days to the Checkout Desk in the library lobby.
- The following forms of identification are also accepted for library card registration: valid driver's license, learner's permit, state ID, fishing license, digital forms of address verification such as an Amazon delivery notification with teen's name and address.

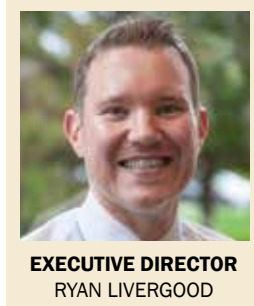

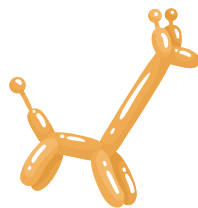
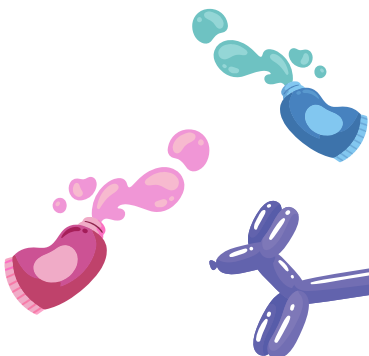

Doorstep Delivery

Warren-Newport Public Library offers Doorstep Delivery for patrons who have difficulty obtaining library materials. Doorstep Delivery is a free service available for district residents of all ages. The service is especially helpful during times when you cannot visit the library building, such as the birth of a child, or recovery from illness, injury or surgery.

A staff member will contact you for arrangements. Please note that a minimum one-week notice must be given to receive Doorstep Delivery services.

Explore More Illinois

Looking for more adventure and excitement for you and your family? The library recently joined Explore More Illinois, a cultural pass program that allows Illinois public library cardholders access and discounts at museums, park districts, historical societies, zoos, arts centers, recreational facilities, and other attractions.

- Visit the Explore More Illinois website at <https://exploremore.quipugroup.net> and enter your WNPL card barcode and PIN.
- Adults ages 18 and up can have up to three reservations at one time, and up to three months in advance.
- Passes can be downloaded or printed.

Upon arrival at the attraction or museum, a photo ID and either a smartphone with the image of the pass or a printed copy of the pass will be requested. Some attractions require a printed copy, which will be indicated when the reservation is completed.

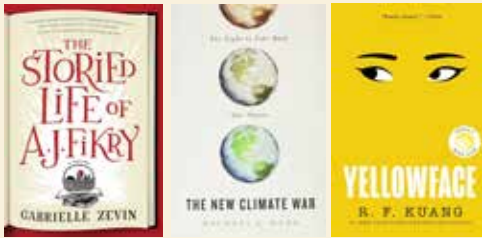

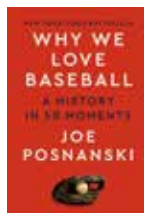

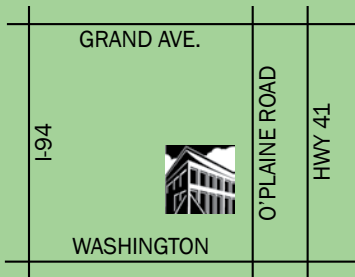
